- **Year of Mercy Pilgrimages** During the year of Mercy, Pope Francis requested that all the cathedrals of the world designate holy doors for pilgrims to pass through. At St. George's Cathedral, a door was created and is available for people to pass through till the end of the Jubilee year in November 2016. In response to this, the chaplain and RE staff took every RE class in year 8 and 9 on Pilgrimage to Southwark Cathedral for a morning or afternoon. Some of the students share their experiences below...

- "I enjoyed coming to the Cathedral because it is where I go to Mass on a Sunday but I never knew about the history of the cathedral or had a chance to have a proper look around. The priest even took us up to where the Bishop sits so we could see his chair and coat of arms"
- "Fr. Ola was very friendly and asked us lots of questions to help us to think about Mercy. I liked the Romero cross and seeing the material from his clothes"
- St. Michael's Day Celebration On Friday 1st July we celebrated St. Michael's day in our school with a day of fun, music and fundraising. Students were allowed to wear their own clothes and each year group came off timetable for the day to participate in fun activities. There was cardboard, glitter, material and tinfoil aplenty as year 7 created mascots for sports day. Year 8 starred in and directed their own short movies whilst year 9 moved around games, sports, music and drama in a carousel of activities.
