Year 12 trip to Parliament



On Monday 8th January 2018, the Year 12 Government, Politics, and History students went to the Houses of Parliament at the Palace of Westminster. This was to enhance our knowledge for our studies in school, but to do so outside of the classroom, as well as to see the Houses of Parliament in person instead of looking at pictures or videos in class.



During the day, we went to the Houses of Parliament and were given a tour around including visiting the House of Lords and House of Commons, standing where the members sit themselves



(including Lord Sugar), as well as being told about the history of the Houses and what happens in its different areas.

We then gathered and spoke to a lady who led a presentation and activities for us to



better understand and get more involved with our electoral system.

After this, our own MP of Southwark Neil Coyle gave his time to speak to us and answer any questions we prepared pre-trip for him, which he was very impressed with, so impressed that he stayed with us. Next, we visited the Supreme Court in Westminster: we went to the exhibition which provided an insight into the work and history of the UK's highest court, as well as the history of the building, and we also went to a court room to see what it is really like in the highest court in the UK and were able to sit in the judges seats, as well as to read documents set out on the side which spoke about the courtroom itself and what type of cases it hears. After this, we walked to 10 Downing Street to see what it looked like. After our lunch, we made our way back to the Houses of Parliament to watch the live debate in the House of Commons at 2:30 regarding the MP's constituencies asking the minister's questions and included the late Minister of Education Justine Greening. - **Lucy Johnson**
