The Year 9 and 10 focus groups have been set up this term to give students a direct way of giving feedback about what is happening in the college to the Headteacher and SLT. The groups are made up of students in Year 9 and 10 who volunteered following assemblies given by Mrs Grabowski and Mr Mahon. One of their first tasks was to set up and run a student surgery where students can drop in during lunchtime to give their opinions and make suggestions about what is happening in the college. ## Year 12 drama Showcase

On Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May, staff and students were privileged to watch the Year 12 As level drama students perform their exam pieces to the examiner.

The three students, Natalie Lloyd, Lawrence Boahen and Jonathon Gutierrez began by performing their monologues. Jonathon performed Freddie from 'A Brief history of Helen of Troy or Everything will be different', Natalie the character of Daisy from 'Daisy Pulls it Off' and Lawrence played Jamal from 'Little Sweet thing'. All three monologues were very different in both tone and style and the students performed in front of an audience, camera and examiner with confidence and style.

The second piece was a play by Pinter, in which the actors had to play multiple parts. Before the performance, the



students had had to study the play closely and create their own interpretation.

'Mountain Language' is set in an unspecified time in an unspecified location in an unspecified country. Pinter suggests that it could represent any country where a group of people are suppressed for their political, social and religious beliefs. During the initial stages of rehearsal, having brought to the fore several contemporary examples of countries in conflict, it was decided that their version would take place in Eastern Europe, inside a derelict and previously deserted warehouse where the country's citizens/revolutionaries were being suppressed by a ruling dictatorship government. The students really brought the sense of oppression and injustice to life through their performance and their planning.

We would like to thank the students, Mrs Murtagh and Miss Ward for giving us the opportunity to see this play.
