There were six different problem solving areas including an electronic maze, giant Towers of Hanoi and Lego reconstruction. The year group was split into teams, competing against each other on each problem in turn. The group that won were awarded prizes in an award ceremony at the end of the day.

The aim of this day was to create a 'can-do' problem solving mentality amongst the students to help them prepare as they embark upon their GCSE Maths course


#### Chaplain's Corner
