




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# St Michael's Halloween Reading Challenge














#### Year 11 Theatre Trip

Theatre Trip On the 15th September 2014, the Year 11 GCSE Drama class went to watch 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time' at the Gielgud Theatre in the West End. The play features a teenage boy, Christopher, who suffers from Asperger's Syndrome, who takes us on a journey, showing how he copes with his family, as well as strangers, his relationships, his pet rat Toby, and his teacher, who also narrates the play and is his conscience. We experience his struggles with him, building an emotional connection with him and the people



in his life throughout the play, achieved through many theatrical techniques. Our seats were in the stalls, meaning we had a brilliant, effective view of the show. The majority of the class said they would see the play again because it showed us somebody's life in a difficult but interesting perspective; it was something we had never seen before. In my opinion, the overall message of the play was that everything may not be as it seems; we cannot judge solely on what we can see because we do not know the background. Also, we shouldn't limit ourselves because even people with unfortunate and life-affecting conditions which limited them can get far in life, like Christopher being able to get A\* in A-level Maths. The play motivated and inspired many people in the audience and I to push myself because it makes me feel that if people who have worst struggles than me in life can succeed greatly, then so can normal people like me.

The competition will be run by Miss El-Janby and is open to all Year 10 students.




### Chaplain's Corner
