

Dear Parents

If you are interested in the degree courses available outside of the UK, I would like to invite you to the Dulwich College Overseas Universities Festival, in the week beginning Monday October 6th.

In addition to talks on **Canadian universities** (Thu 9th, 4pm, Lord George Building) and **studying in Hong Kong** (Thu 9th, 7pm, Lord George Building), we also have two major public talks:

US Universities open evening, Mon Oct 6th, 7.30pm, Great Hall

There are over 4,000 universities in America, all offering 4 year courses where students study a broad range of subjects. Universities are extremely well-funded, with **spectacular facilities**, both for study and extra-curricular activities, especially sport.

For gifted athletes and scholars, scholarships can make study in the US cheaper than the UK; several American universities will pay for all your tuition, accommodation, food and flights - effectively a **completely free education** - if your household earnings are below \$100,000 a year. Households earning under \$200,000 a year can also expect significant reductions in fees to make costs comparable with a UK education.

Dutch Universities open evening, Wed Oct 8th, 7.30pm, Great Hall

Holland's university cohort now ranks 3rd internationally behind the US and UK and there are 14 universities in Holland with **Russell Group equivalent** ranking offering courses in English with **tuition fees at around £2,000 a year**.

With small classes (some insist on **no more than 12 students per group**), innovative, **interactive teaching** methods integrated with industry and based around collaborative as well as individual work, the Dutch higher education system is arguably the most progressive in the world.

For both talks, there will be presentations in the Great Hall from 7.30, followed by a Q&A session and a chance to meet advisors individually.
