


The Great Exhibition

9O have been studying the Great Exhibition of 1851 as part of their wider studies of the Industrial Revolution and the British Empire. They made their own exhibits with

accompanying written plaques and invited teachers to their Friday lesson whilst they turned S09 into 'The Great Exhibition' of 1851.

Here's an eyewitness account from one visitor – a Mrs Chilton-Higgins who was transported back to





1851 by 9O's 'Great Exhibition'.

June 1st 1851

When I stepped off the omnibus and observed the glittering palace constructed of glass

and iron, stretched up higher than the trees, I knew I was in for an indulgence I had read so much about it in the preceding month that I had to perceive for myself what all the commotion was about. There was so much to see that I doubt that any mere mortal could resist a return visit. In fact I know our very own Queen Victoria has been back several times but it was so

> busy that even if she had been standing next to me I would not have noticed. Mind you I am certain she did not have to pay the one shilling entrance fee.

> With over 100,000 objects to see I hardly knew where to start and the more I saw and read the more amazed I became by our great inventors and engineers. Did you know that a thing called a 'boomerang' returns to you if you throw it? Or that there is such a thing as an entire egg made of chocolate called an 'Easter egg'? Miss Keisha Sandy's Postal Office was astonishing and I could have listened all day to Mr Jayden Lewis Esquire talk about his exhibit.

the camera or phonogram will ever become very popular, except as a novelty item.

The response from students and staff was very encouraging as everyone got on board


