The RE department will accompany some students to represent our college at this Mass.
- **CAFOD Lenten Fast Day** We raised £126.83 at lunchtime on the 10<sup>th</sup> of March for this worthy charity.
- **£510** was raised for The Mercy International Association by selling wristbands in support of ending human trafficking.
- Year 8 Retreat From Wednesday 7th of June to Friday 9th June, 30 year 8 students will have the opportunity to travel to St. Vincent's Centre, Whitstable for a residential retreat. The students are given an opportunity to take time out from the routine pressures of everyday life to reflect on themselves, their relationship with others and their relationship with God.
