In St. Michael's we have our own advent wreath that we will light daily in assembly but there will also be weekly prayers in the chapel at break time on a Tuesday and Thursday. All students and staff are welcome to attend.

The team also give chaplaincy related announcements around the school and distribute the Wednesday Word to year seven.
