- Charity non-uniform day —On the last day of last term (21st July) £500 was raised for the East Africa appeal where Brutal conflict and drought has led to famine, food scarcity and extreme levels of poverty. This has left 800,000 children suffering from severe malnutrition. 16 million in East Africa are on the brink of death and 23 million are in urgent need of food, water and medical treatment.
