Year 10 Geography Trip

Last week the Year 10 Geographers undertook a fieldwork investigation along the Dorset coastline. Their aim was to investigate the natural processes occurring along the coastline as part of their GCSE course.



On arrival, the students hiked four miles from Studland to Swanage observing a variety of coastal landforms that they had previously only seen in their textbooks. On day 2, the students familiarised themselves with a range of fieldwork techniques including groyne profiles, wave counts and questionnaires. To complete the 3 days in Dorset we visited Lulworth Cove and the limestone arch of Durdle Dor where students perfected their field sketch

SAINT PETER SAINT PAUL

Solemnity of Saint Peter and Saint Paul

The feast day of Saint Peter and Paul is on June the 29th and is a holy Day of Obligation for Catholics in England.

St Peter was one of Jesus Christ's 12 apostles and spent most of his life preaching the Christian gospel after Jesus' death. He died by crucifixion around 67 CE and is regarded as the Catholic church's first pope.

St Paul, formerly known as Saul of Tarsus, was converted to Christianity on the road to Damascus shortly after Jesus Christ's death. He became an influential leader in the Christian church. He was beheaded around the year 67 CE during the Roman emperor Nero's persecution of the Christians.

On the Feast of St Peter and St Paul, the Catholic pope places the pallium (a type of woolen cloak) on archbishops that were appointed over the past year. It serves as a reminder of religious significance of the bishops' work and symbolizes the unity of the church.
