What the College Expects of Pupils

- Respect other pupils and College staff in a Christian manner.
- Complete, to the highest possible standards, all homework and other learning tasks on time.
- Respond to every challenge with hard work and a determination to succeed.
- Take part in sports and other extra-curricular activities.

What the College Expects of Parents

Parents of children at St Michael's College will ensure that their children:

- Fully support spiritual and moral aspects of College life.
- Maintain full attendance and excellent punctuality.
- Will not be absent from College because of family holidays.
- Adhere to the College Rules and accept punishment if they transgress.
- Wear the full College Uniform and have the required equipment for College. This includes inappropriate hairstyles.
- Complete all homework and other learning tasks on time.
- Spend the recommended amount of time on homework.
- Participate fully in sports and other extra-curricular activities.
