


# Duke of Edinburgh Assessment Expedition

Members of the public kept commenting on how well behaved and polite our students were (the children with the bright orange bags)!














## BBC Academy School Representatives at the

In the slow motion topic, we did practicals including popping balloons and flicking cards towards the camera. After we were showed how it looked like in slow motion. It was explained to us how they used slow motion effects in the BBC broadcast environment and why it made such a big difference to TV shows and advertisements etc. We also

looked into the investigation of a data leakage of the new Doctor Who series. There were three different suspects and we got a chance to investigate each, asking them questions and looking into their history. 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
#### Year 12 Future First Career in Business Afternoon
