
Chaplaincy Bulletin – Issue 39

- This month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus -The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost. In addition to the liturgical celebration, many devotional exercises are connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Of all devotions, devotion to the Sacred Heart was, and remains, one of the most widespread and popular in the Church. Our Friday Mass on the 28th of June will be dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
