- Lenten reconciliation services students in year 8, 9 10 and 11 had the opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation from one of our local priests. (see pictures below)
- Friday Morning Mass The most recent Masses (in the first 3 weeks of March) were led by the following tutor groups-9RU, 10RU and 11RU. Father Keith has kindly led these Masses for us, we continue to be very grateful for his support of this important sacrament, and we look forward to the time when we can meet up again for Masses in our own parishes and in our own chapel.
- CAFOD Lenten Fast Day We raised £142.40 at lunchtime on the 6^h of March for this worthy charity. This year the theme was "give it up" and CAFOD will use this money to support short- and long-term projects in the world's poorest countries
- Year 8 Retreat workshop -this took place in our school hall and classrooms on the 6th of March. It was a retreat project with an outside company called Protection Approaches with the theme of

the day focusing on diversity and inclusion, including a Refugee Survivor Speaker. The aims were to give students increased empathy towards those who are the victims of identity-based violence and prejudice, particularly refugees and an understanding of the importance of gaining information from multiple sources. Each student also wrote a promise —saying how they will make their school or community a safer, kinder place for all

- May Devotions-May Devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary refers to special Marian devotions held in the Catholic Church during the month of May honouring the Virgin Mary as "the Queen of May". These services will also be put on hold in the present situation.
- House competitions-there was a Table tennis inter-house competition on the 5th of March and inter-house rounders competition on the 28th of March and we have had the Mazzarello charity week (4^{th-}8th).
