The college is proud of all of our students who have had to overcome so many challenges beyond their control in recent months and we wish them well as they take their next steps.



As we begin our 4th week into the Autumn term, I cannot believe we are already half way into the term. I hope you and your families are well and remain healthy and safe.

Today's scripture is a focus on St Matthew.

Little is known about St. Matthew, except that he was the son of Alpheus, and he was likely born in Galilee. He worked as a tax collector, which was a hated profession during the time of Christ.

According to the Gospel, Matthew was working at a collection booth in Capernaum when Christ came to him and asked, "Follow me." With this simple call, Matthew became a disciple of Christ.

From Matthew we know of the many doings of Christ and the message Christ spread of salvation for all people who come to God through Him. The Gospel account of Matthew tells the same story as that found in the other three Gospels, so scholars are certain of its authenticity. His book is the first of the four Gospels in the New Testament.

Matthew 9:9-13

- 9 As Jesus passed by, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the customs post. He said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him.
- 10 While he was at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners came and sat with Jesus and his disciples.
- 11 The Pharisees saw this and said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"
- 12 He heard this and said, "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do.
- 13 Go and learn the meaning of the words, I desire mercy, not sacrifice. I did not come to call the righteous but sinners."
