 If there's a risk of splashing to the eyes, such as from coughing, spitting or vomiting, supervising staff will also wear eye protection

Supervising staff will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after the pupil has been picked up.

We will provide home testing kits to parents/carers collecting symptomatic children, and to staff who've developed symptoms at college, if they are unable to get a test elsewhere.

A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been

(G22 and any toilets used in the first instance), and PPE will be disposed of properly, following <u>decontamination</u> guidance.

If the college becomes aware that a pupil or a staff member has tested positive for coronavirus, and needs advice on next steps, the college will contact the DfE helpline on **0800 046 8687** and select option 1. (If no advice is required, the school will report the case using the DfE's 'online attendance form daily return'). The advice service (or local health protection team, if the call is escalated to them), will carry out a rapid risk assessment to confirm who's been in close contact with the person when infectious.

The college will ask all close contacts of anyone testing positive due to

- All staff working on the college site full time will be required to consent to twice weekly lateral flow testing.
- From 22/02/21 due to an increase in student and staff numbers onsite SLT will self test at home – in line with guidance given to primary colleagues who are following this process. As an extra precaution they will need to have a follow up PCR test in the event of a positive LFT.
- Any contractors/technicians coming onsite from Engie or other external companies and working on the main college site will be required to take a LFT before commencing work onsite.
- n. B anyone who has tested positive needs to wait 45 days until they can start taking lateral flow tests.

Face Coverings: Changes from 11/01/21 for key worker/vulnerable provision

All staff on the key worker/vulnerable rota must wear face coverings in communal areas and when supervising students, including when in the classrooms. Staff who are exempt from wearing a face covering must wear a visor.

Staff/students who refuse to be tested pose a major health and safety risk to staff and students onsite and their families at this time.

Students who are not tested will therefore be required to complete remote learning at home as it is too high risk to have them onsite. They will be supported to access the full programme of remote learning from home on Google classroom-This is exactly the same provision as they would receive onsite, as students attending the college site are supervised whilst they complete remote learning on Google classroom.

Vulnerable students will have regular safeguarding checks and if they have a social worker, they will

We will ask **all staff and pupils** to take a lateral flow test. Staff will be tested once a week on an ongoing basis.

If the test is **positive**, we will follow the same steps (laid out above) as if that pupil/staff member were displaying symptoms, including asking them to take a standard coronavirus test at home.

We will continue to:

Help with identifying staff and pupils' close contacts, records will be kept of:

 - Being coughed on

- Proximity contacts extended close contact (within 1 to 2 metres for more than 15

Any contractors visiting the college site rota must socially distance and wear face coverings in communal areas and in the presence of any other person, Anyone who is exempt from wearing a face covering must wear a visor.

All students attending the key worker/vulnerable provision must wear face coverings in all communal areas and classrooms. Students who are exempt must wear a visor instead.

When the college is in tier 2, 3 or 4, or during national lockdown: Everyone will be asked to wear face coverings when moving around the school, unless they're exempt from wearing one. They'll be given clear instructions about how to put on, remove and store/dispose of face coverings safely.

Staff and visitors will wear face coverings in areas of the school where social distancing isn't possible, such as some offices. They will be asked to keep on or put on a face covering when arriving at school and moving to classrooms or offices, unless they're exempt from wearing one. They'll be given clear instructions about how to put on, remove and store/dispose of face coverings safely.

For pupils who routinely attend other settings on a part-time basis, such as an alternative provision setting, the school will work with these other settings to work out a system to keep these pupils safe.

Pupil groups will have staggered timetables, including for start and finish times and designated spaces for break and lunch times to avoid too many pupils being in one place at the same time.

Movement around the college site will be kept to a minimum to avoid creating busy corridors- Year group zones, set **boxes** – Vouchers issued to parents weekly, if breakfast boxes are requested there will be contactless collection with the following protocols in place:

- Staggered pick-up times
- Marking out spots to queue
- Only allowing one parent/carer to attend
- Students with families shielding will have a noncontact delivery of the breakfast boxes made by a member of SLT
- KW/Vulnerable students free lunch provided to all students.
- Educational visits will not take place

Pregnant staff will not be required to continue working if this is not supported by the risk assessment, and will be offered alternative arrangements (which may include working from home or suspension on normal pay). Staff who are 28 weeks pregnant or beyond, or staff who are pregnant with underlying health conditions, will be considered clinically extremely vulnerable and offered further flexibility to work from

During a national lockdown the following additional preventative measures will be in place:

- All staff working on the college site will be expected to consent to weekly lateral flow testing if part time and twice weekly lateral flow testing if full time.
- All students attending KW/vulnerable student provision will be expected to consent to weekly lateral flow testing. Parents to consent if students are under 16.
