Trip-Year 10 and 11 GCSE Music to concert -London Schools Symphony Orchestra



On the 20th of September, the Music Department took pupils from the GCSE Music classes, to a concert at the Barbican Centre to hear performances by the London Schools Symphony Orchestra. Hailed by Sir Simon Rattle as "an incomparable ambassador for the dynamism and excellence of British youth", the London Schools Symphony Orchestra has for over 70 years been regarded as a potent symbol of the talents and achievements of London's finest musicians.

Founded in 1951 by Dr Leslie Russell, to give young musicians from schools in London the opportunity to perform with professional conductors and soloists.

One of our GCSE Music pupils, Caspar G. in Year 11, is a member of the LSSO and plays in the French horn section. This was our second trip to the Barbican to cheer him on! A wonderful evening of classical music making was experienced and greatly appreciated by pupils who were astounded by the virtuosity of Londoner Leia Zhu, the violin soloist in the Brahms Violin concerto. At only 15 years old, Leia has already become an international performer at the highest level and inspired our pupils as well as helping them to understand more deeply, key components required for their listening exams.

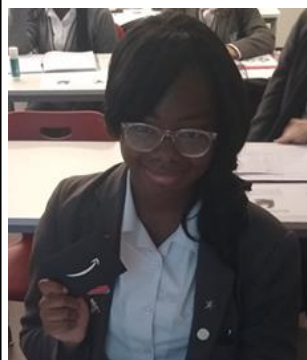
