## Luso Club

St Michael's has a fairly significant population of Luso speaking students, this means pupils with a Portuguese speaking background. In order to encourage their interest in their own cultures and expand their cultural knowledge, the MFL Department -in collaboration with the Geography Department- is running every Tuesday a weekly 30-minute club in which we introduce KS3 students to a wide variety of subjects connected with Brazil, Portugal and beyond.

The club started late in September and so far, we have discussed issues related to literature, architecture, sports, music and history. The club is run by William Martin and Juan Toledo from the Geography and MFL departments respectively.
