Brilliant Scholars Go to Oxford University!

Fourteen Year 7 students were selected to enroll on the prestigious Brilliant Scholars programme this term. This project aims to introduce students to an experience of university learning that will not only widen their understanding of further education but to also develop a range of valuable transferable skills. These students attend six small group university-style tutorials with a university lecturer, who is an expert in their field and will support them to produce a formal university-style assessment. This term's topic will be History – "Windrush, Migration and Belonging in Modern Britain." As part of the programme, these students attended an inauguration day at New College, University of Oxford. Once we arrived there we looked through a presentation explaining the different activities we would be doing around the college.
