





Feast Day St. Francis de Sales


Wednesday 24th January

The word 'Salesian' derives from a seventeenth-century thinker and Saint, Francis de Sales.

He was a Bishop of Geneva and became noted for his deep faith and his gentle approach to the religious divisions in his land resulting from the Protestant Reformation.

His optimistic humanism uncovered a spiritual depth within relationships, encouraging people to engage with the heart rather than through an impersonal authority.

He spoke about the strength of real gentleness and the ability of a warm, consistent approach to working with people that could transform their experience of life.






Year 9 Retreat (X Band) Friday 26th Jan – Period 4b and Period 5






