St Michael's is a National Award Winner!

St Michael's Catholic College is delighted that our excellent results have been recognised by SSAT (The Schools, Students and Teachers Network) in this year's Educational Outcomes Awards.

The first is for being in the top 10% of non-selective schools nationally for student attainment, the 2nd is for being in the top 20% for progress, and the 3rd is the Closing the Gap Achievement Award.

The Closing the Gap Achievement Award is for schools achieving high levels of performance for students eligible for the Pupil Premium.

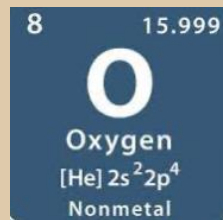
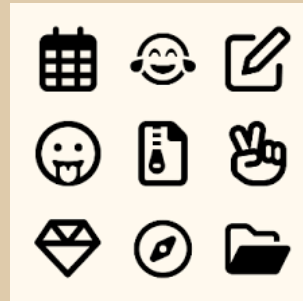


Figure 1: A photograph of a total solar eclipse.

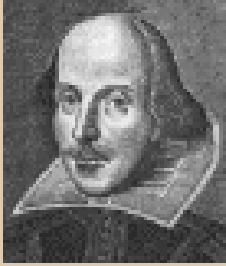

- Discuss how knowledge can be encoded and decoded through signs

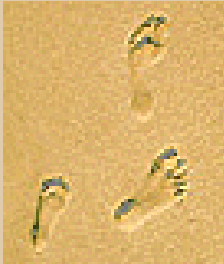

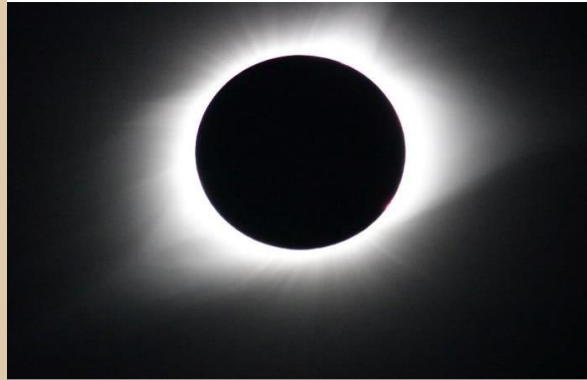


Figure 1: A photograph of a total solar eclipse.

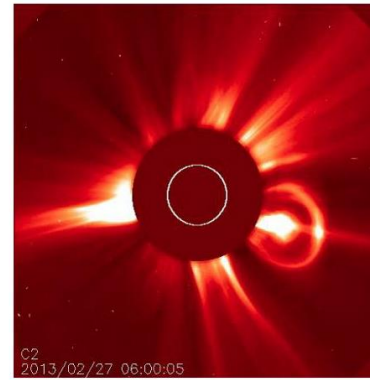
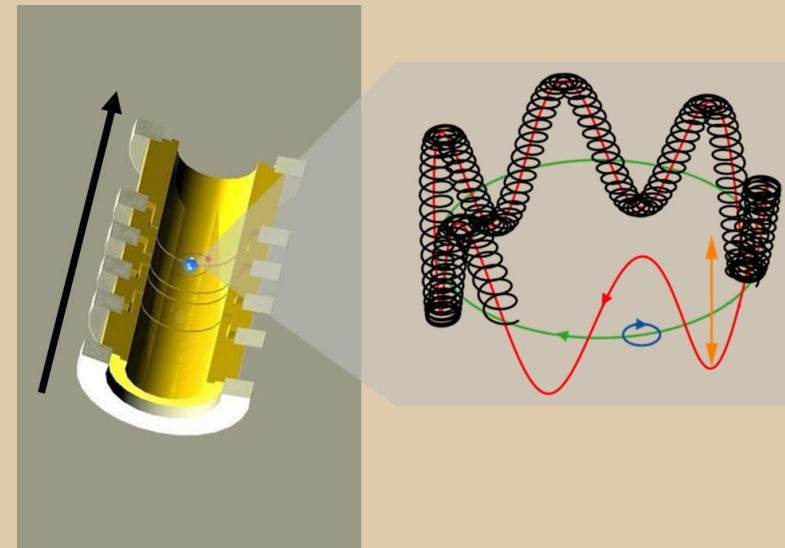


Figure 2: A coronagraph showing the Sun's corona. This image shows solar eruptions including solar flares and a coronal loop. Credit: NASA/ESA SOHO

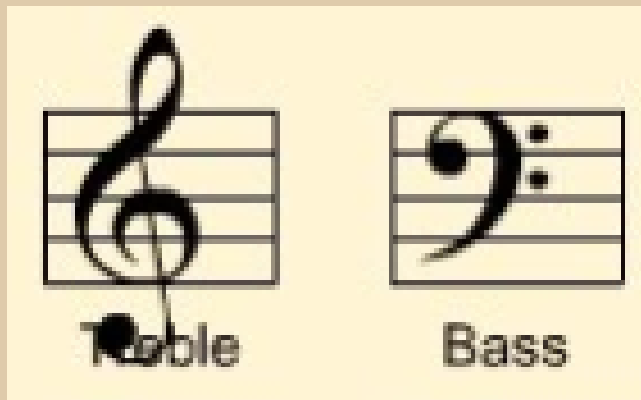
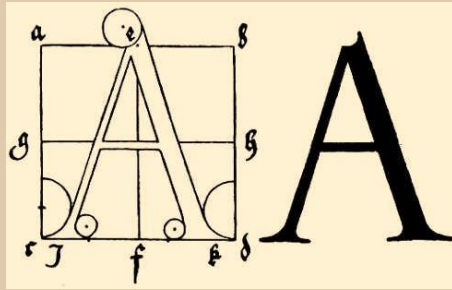

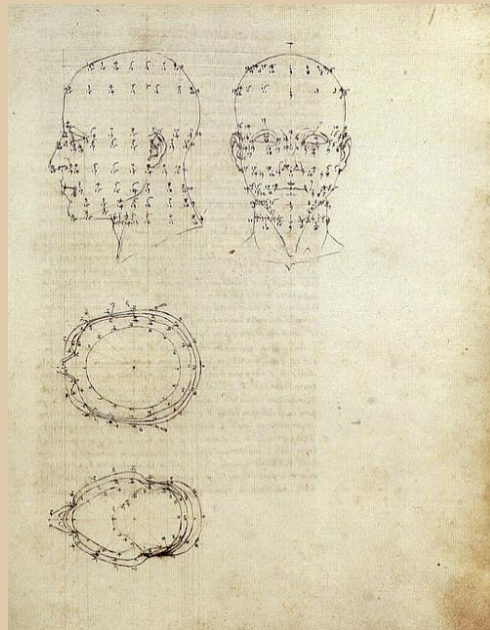


Signs of Interdisciplinarity

"If we look at the ancients, physics would to be concerned with the matter. (It was only very slightly that Empedocles and Democritus touched on the forms and the essence.) But if on the other hand art imitates nature, and it is the part of the same discipline to know the form and the matter up to a point (e.g. the doctor has a knowledge of health and also of bile and phlegm, in which health is realized, and the builder both of the form of the house and of the matter, namely that it is bricks and beams, and so forth): if this is so, it would be the part of physics also to know nature in both its senses"
