AI supporting Business

2 very techy presentations from teams from *The Economist*. Suitable for STEM and Business students in Years 10 and 12.

G18: 3.30-4.15 **Wednesday May 7th** **AI-Powered Personalisation:**

This session would focus on how The Economist uses AI to encourage its subscribers to consumer more of its *existing* content and products. The team will talk about how we use personalisation algorithms to recommend articles, podcasts, videos, etc that our subscribers might like - showcasing the technical foundations [e.g. how these algorithms work under the bonnet] and the business impact of these approaches

G18 3.30-4.15 **Tuesday May 13th** **Consumer Research & Experiments:**

This session would focus on the other end of the telescope i.e. how do we figure out what new content and products our subscribers and potential future subscribers might be like. We'll talk about how we combine consumer interviews and surveys with randomised controlled trials to establish appetite and willingness to pay for new products - and how we use AI to turbo-charge this discovery process.

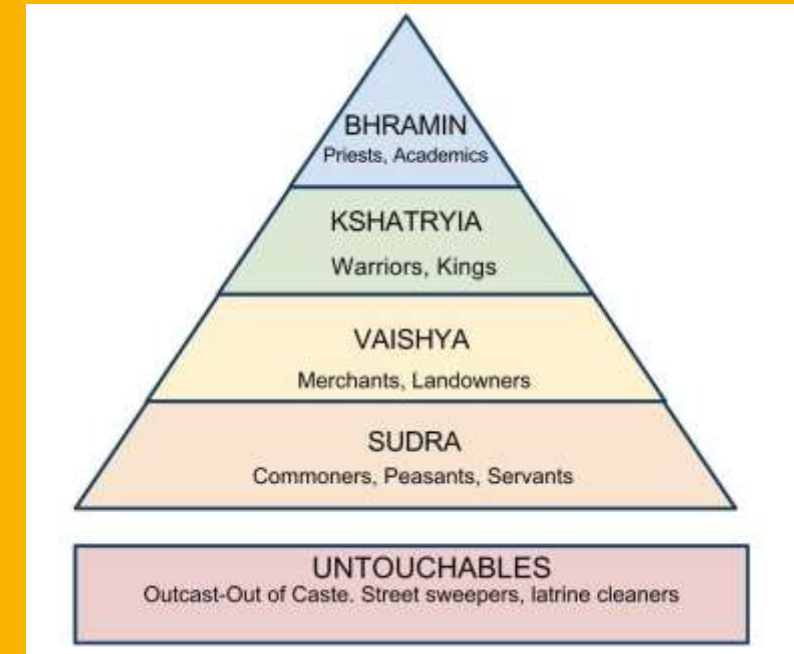

80 Anniversary of VE Day

Thursday 8th May



What is VE day and when was it?

The 80th anniversary of VE Day will be marked on 8 May 2025 – signalling eight decades since the end of the Second World War in Europe.

On 8 May 1945, people in Britain and across the world celebrated Victory in Europe, now known as VE Day. This marked the unconditional surrender of Germany and meant an end to nearly six years of a war. Some people celebrated early. Many people in Britain didn't wait for the official day of celebration and began the festivities as soon as they heard the news on 7 May. After years of wartime restrictions and dangers – from food and clothes rationing to blackouts and bombing raids – many were finally able to let loose and enjoy themselves.

The day became a public holiday, with parties on the streets across the nation, running late into the night. Villages, towns, and cities were decorated with flags and bunting.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill addressed a crowd of thousands from the balcony of the Ministry of Health in Whitehall. The future Queen, Princess Elizabeth, secretly joined in the festivities, while servicemen, servicewomen, and civilians from Britain, the USA and other Allied Nations celebrated together in a day of unity.

Why is this occasion important?

VE Day is significant as it is a way of recognising the sacrifices made during the challenging years of World War 2 by so many people across Britain and throughout the world.

The residents of Bermondsey and South and East London were directly impacted as a result of years of bombings especially during “The Blitz”

We remember the bravery of ordinary people who did extraordinary acts to fight for the freedoms we all enjoy today which defeated fascism and the Nazis.
