






Hot Weather!

<u>Y7, Y8 and Y9 in G10</u>

Greater representation of women within the Church and better inclusivity of the LGBT community – these are some of the big issues the Synod process is addressing. Synodality is a key element of Pope Francis' vision for the Church, aiming to foster a more inclusive and participatory Church. Pope Leo wants this continued.

Dr Janet Obeney-Williams from LGBT Catholics at Westminster is involved in the Synod process here and in Rome. She wants to talk to you about the process and listen to your opinions and give you a voice in changing things.








Wednesday 25th June – Period 2
