- **Receive** an accreditation at the end for use **professionally**

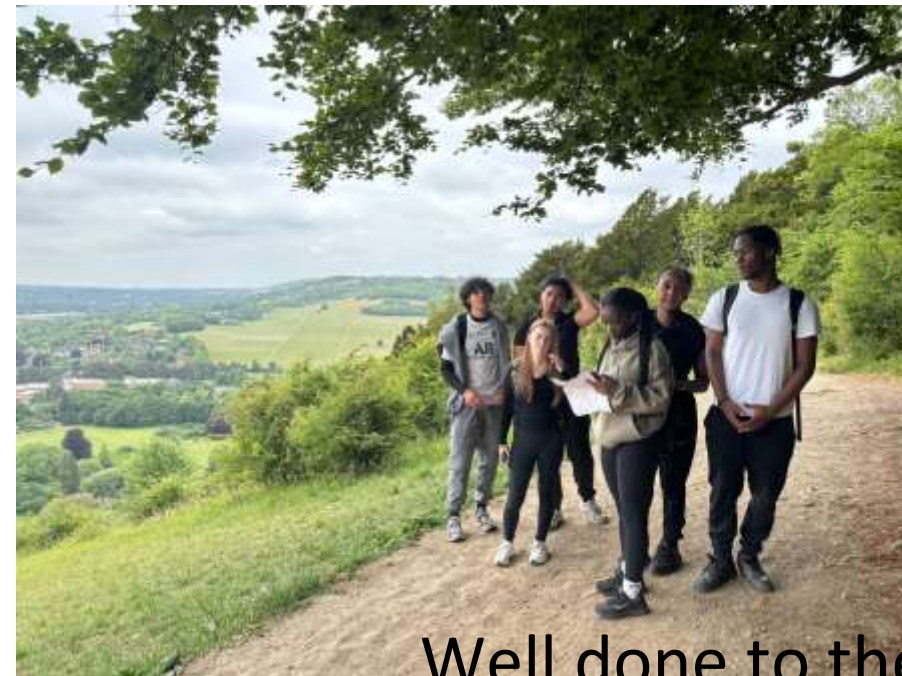
The **school can apply for three fully funded places**, please speak to **Miss Hayden (\$25)** if you are interested.

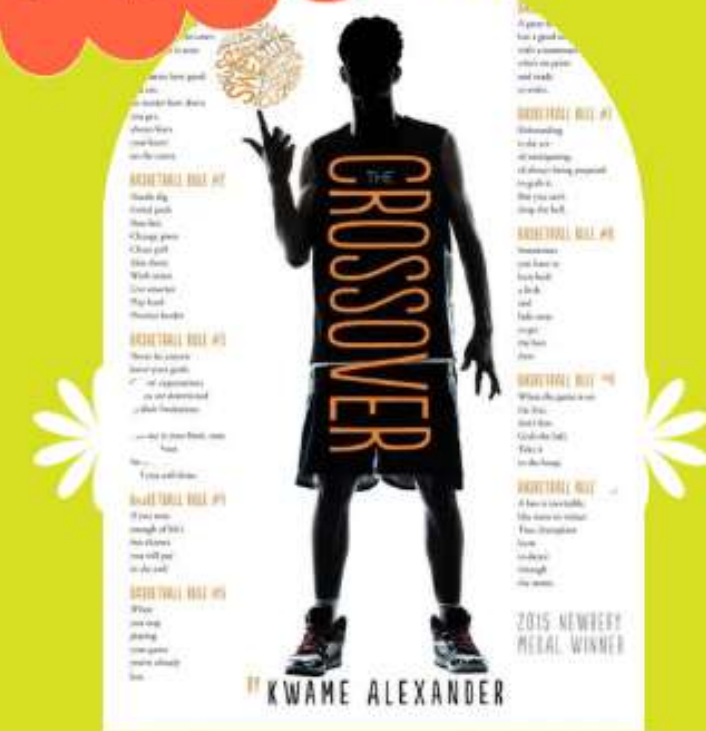

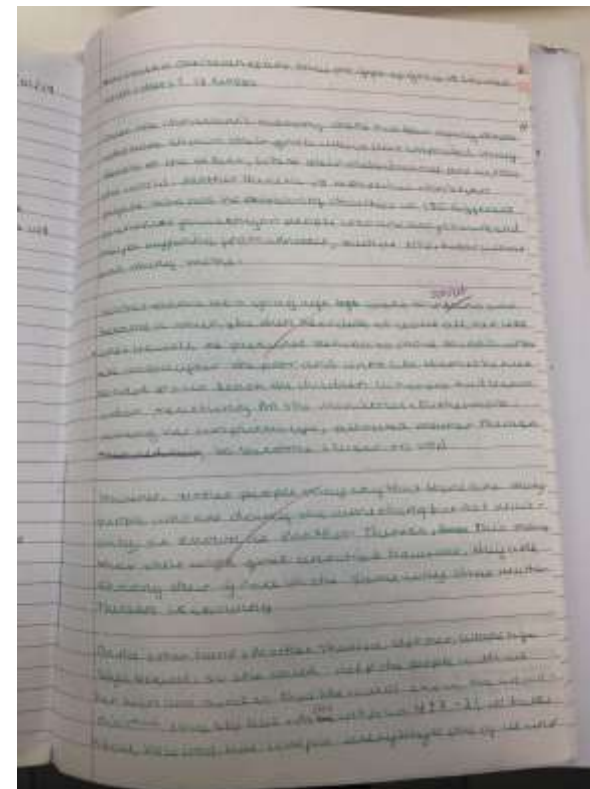
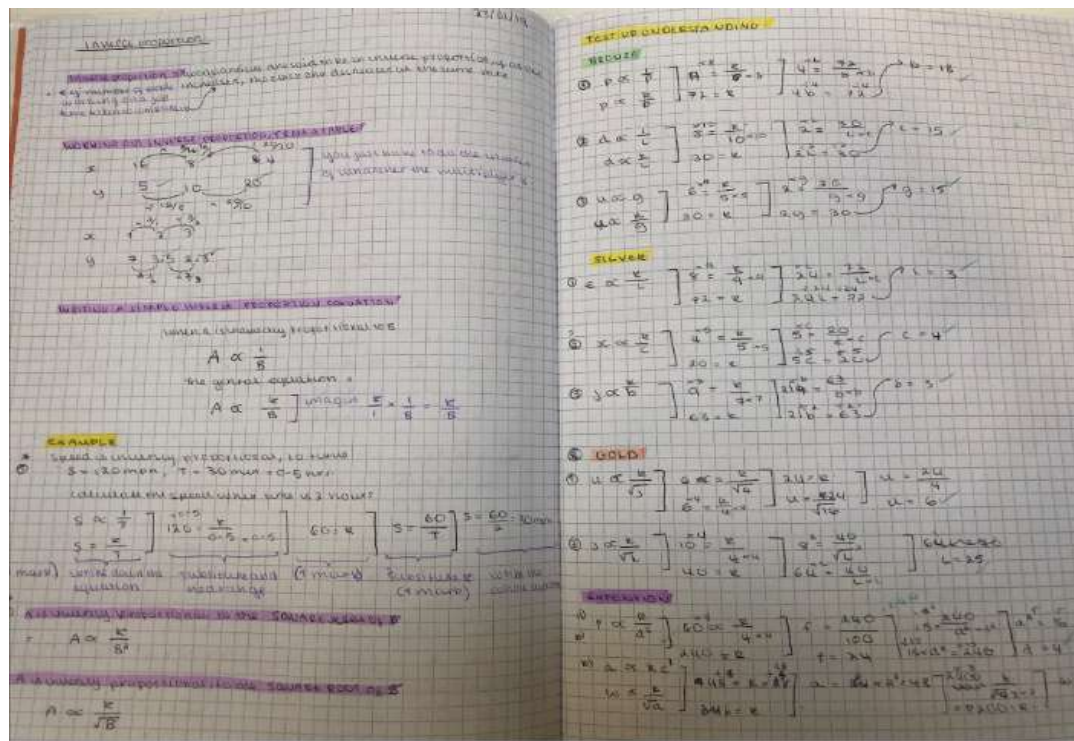
