HOT WEATHER PROTOCOLS



IN THE HOT WEATHER THE FOLLOWING PROTOCOLS ARE IN PLACE AND MUST BE FOLLOWED:

- Students should **NOT** be wearing jumpers or cardigans as part of their uniform and coats should not be brought to school.
- Students can wear white short sleeved shirts..
- Students removing blazers, need to ensure shirts are tucked in, skirts are not rolled over and trousers are worn properly and with a belt if needed.
- 6th form students may also remove blazers, but must ensure all other aspects of their clothing comply with the 6th form dress code. Sleeveless tops, t-shirts, crop tops and vests or tops with spaghetti straps are not allowed. Trousers must be worn properly and skirts should be knee length and not made out of stretchy material.
- Students **MUST** bring a bottle of water with them to school each day. Bottles can be refilled at a water station in the playground.
- If students have an outdoor PE lesson/sports club they may wish to bring sun cream to put on and they will be allowed to keep water with them.
- Students may use handheld fans **outside** at break and lunchtime. However, they are **NOT** allowed to be used inside the buildings or classrooms as they can be disruptive. Any handheld fans are brought at students own risk.
- We expect students to follow instructions to stay in shaded areas and to not overexert themselves outside at break and lunchtime.
- Occasionally in warmer weather students may be tempted to mess around with water. Not only is this wasteful but it causes unnecessary disruption. The school policy is that Saturday detentions are given in these instances.
