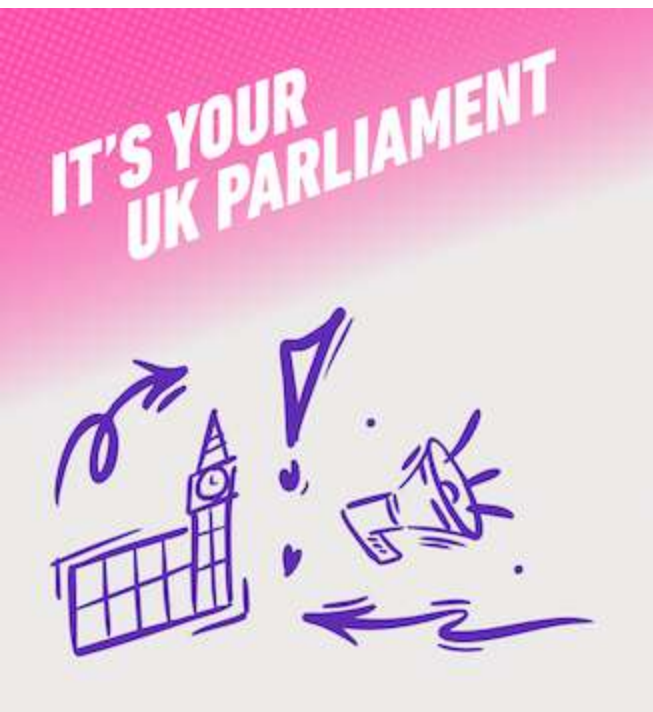

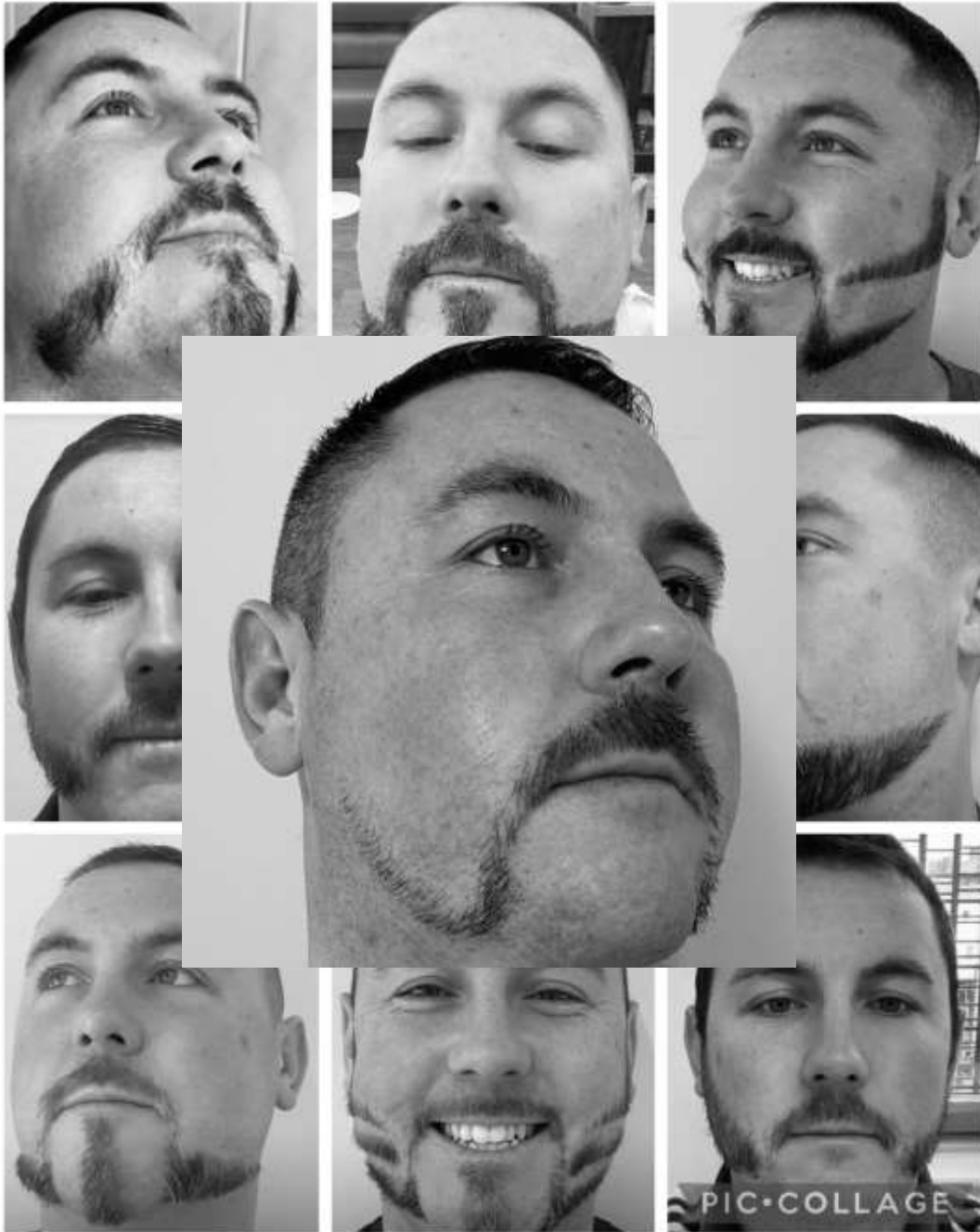

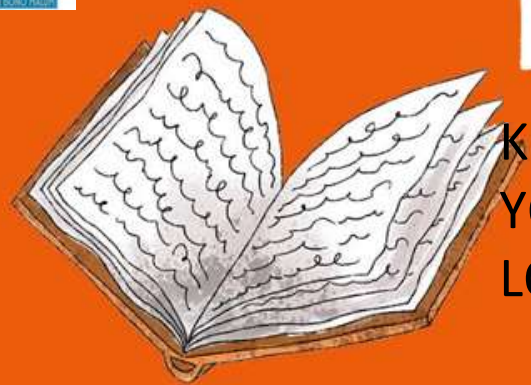

Metamorphosis
by Franz Kafka

'One morning, when Gregor Samsa, woke from troubled dreams, he found himself transformed in his bed into a horrible vermin.'

Thus begins *The Metamorphosis*, cited as one of the seminal works of fiction of the twentieth-century. A story of Gregor Samsa, a travelling salesman, who wakes up one day to discover that he has metamorphosed into a bug. *The Metamorphosis* is a book that concerns itself with the themes of alienation, disillusionment and existentialism.

As Samsa struggles to reconcile his humanity with his transformation, Kafka, very deftly, weaves his readers into a web that deals with the absurdity of existence, the alienating experience of modern life, and the cruelty and incomprehensibility of authoritarian power, leaving them once stunned and impressed.

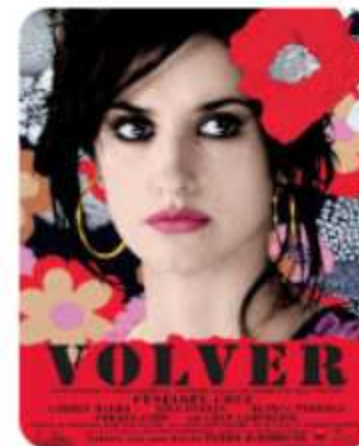

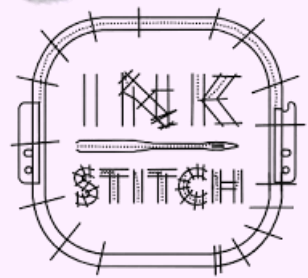
