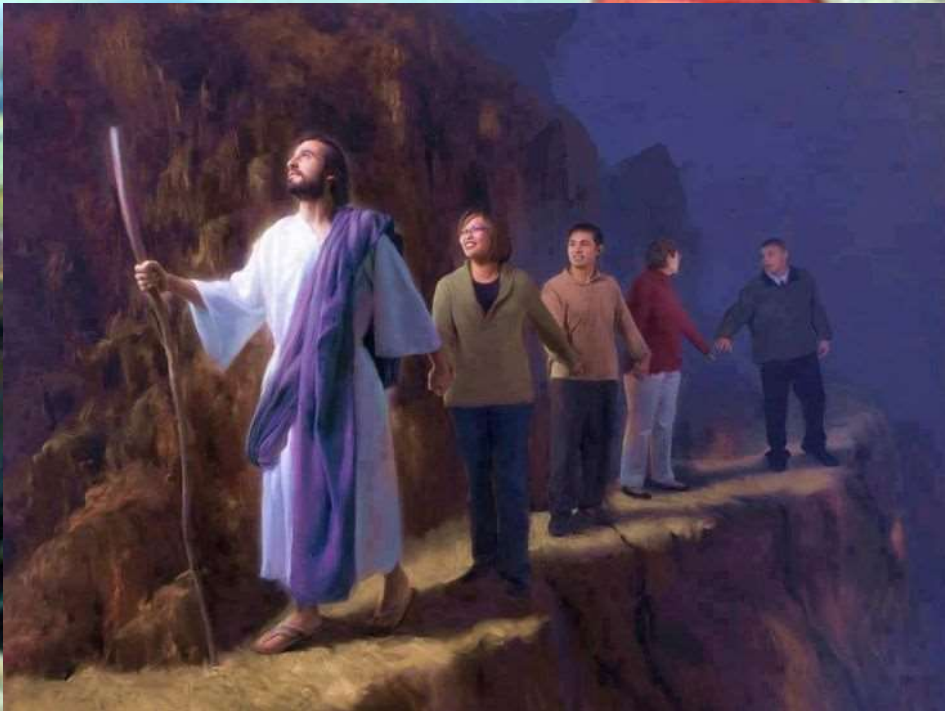


Question:
