Grant us the faith and courage of Mary, that we may always say "Yes" to your will, even when the path is uncertain, trusting completely in your divine plan.


Through the example of the Immaculate Virgin, teach us to be humble and faithful disciples, carrying Christ into our world, into our school, and into our homes.





Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain.


And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together.
