Scoring

Scoring rules for the Intermediate Mathematical Challenge are as follows:

- A total of 135 marks can be achieved in the IMC
- 5 marks are awarded for each correct answer to questions 1 – 15
- 6 marks are awarded for each correct answer to questions 16 – 25
- Each incorrect answer to questions 16 – 20 loses 1 mark
- Each incorrect answer to questions 21 – 25 loses 2 marks
- Answers left blank will be marked as 0

Around the top 500 scorers in England, Wales and Overseas Year 11, Scotland S4 and Northern Ireland Year 12 will qualify for the Maclaurin Olympiad.

The next 4,000 (approx.) of England and Wales Year 9 and below, Scotland S2 and below and Northern Ireland Year 10 and below will qualify to sit the Grey Kangaroo (UK Schools only).

The next 7,000 (approx.) in England and Wales Year 10, Year 11, Scotland S3, Scotland S4, Northern Ireland Year 11 and Year 12 will qualify to sit the Pink Kangaroo (UK Schools only)





BLACK STAR by Kwame Alexander

Twelve-year old Charley is set on becoming the first female pitcher to play professional baseball, even if that's a lofty dream for a Black girl in the American South in the 1920s. Even so, her grandfather Kofi's thrilling stories about courageous ancestors and epic journeys make it impossible not to dream big. She knows he has so much more to tell, but according to her parents, she isn't old enough to know about certain things, like what happened to Booker Preston that one night in Great Bridge, and why she can never play on the brand-new baseball field on the other side of town.

When Charley challenges a neighbourhood bully to a game at the church picnic, she knows she can win, even with her ragtag team. Then a dispute on the field leads to Charley making a fateful decision, one that will bring consequences she never could have imagined.
