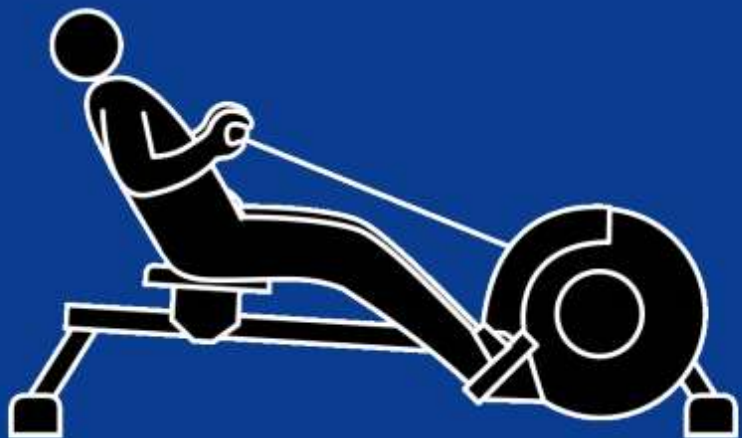
Y13 Leavers Yearbook Photos
