

At the Potter's House

This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: **2** “Go down to the potter’s house, and there I will give you my message.” **3** So I went down to the potter’s house, and I saw him working at the wheel. **4** But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him.

5 Then the word of the LORD came to me. **6** He said, “Can I not do with you, Israel, as this potter does?” declares the LORD. “Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, Israel. **7** If at any time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be uprooted, torn down and destroyed, **8** and if that nation I warned repents of its evil, then I will relent and not inflict on it the disaster I had planned. **9** And if at another time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be built up and planted, **10** and if it does evil in my sight and does not obey me, then I will reconsider the good I had intended to do for it.

11 “Now therefore say to the people of Judah and those living in Jerusalem, ‘This is what the LORD says: Look! I am preparing a disaster for you and devising a plan against you. So turn from your evil ways, each one of you, and reform your ways and your actions.’”

Thank You for loving us enough to shape and reshape our lives according to Your perfect will. When we are stubborn, soften our hearts. When we are broken or marred by sin, do not give up on us—mold us again with Your mercy and grace.

How can we effectively withstand and endure any pressures this Lent?

Therefore, since through God’s mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart. Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone’s conscience in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus’ sake. For God, who said, “Let light shine out of darkness,” made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God’s glory displayed in the face of Christ.

But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may be revealed in our body. For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus’ sake, so that his life may also be revealed in our mortal body. So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in

In these days of reflection and repentance, help us to renounce any of our secret or shameful ways.

Strip away the pride and veils which blind us, so that we may clearly see the glorious light of the gospel of Christ.

We confess that we are merely jars of clay - fragile, imperfect and prone to breaking. Yet we thank you that this weakness is by your design, to display that the all-surpassing power we hold belongs entirely to you, and not us.







Entrants will also have access to an essay writing guide, a working with sources guide as well as a range of primary sources to get started with. This topic is linked to the GCSE Thematic Study on Empire, Migration and Peoples.

Food from the canteen is not allowed to be taken outside as it encourages rats/pigeons etc which is a health risk.




