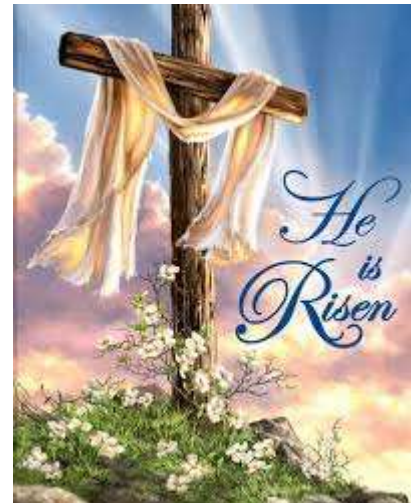
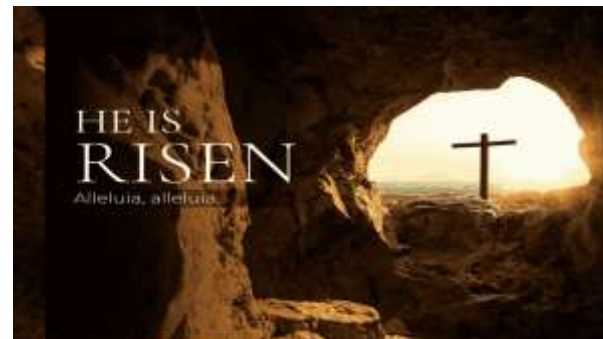
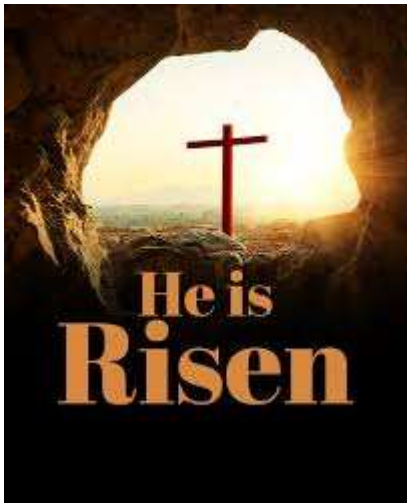

Prayer at St. Michael's Catholic College

Prayer and reflection is an important part of our day at St. Michael's Catholic College

We encourage students to lead prayer during morning and afternoon registration and the beginning of lessons

Each tutor group should have a prayer table for which the House Captain is responsible for looking after – on which should sit the form class prayer book and other Holy/significant objects

Prayer table cloths should now be green as Lent is now over

Students can also write their own prayer and submit for the weekly student notices – email Mr Kelly with your prayer submission by Friday of each week



Travelling to and from College



You must travel straight home after school has finished – there should be no hanging around the local area as residents complain about the noise.

You should be wearing your full school uniform properly as you travel to and from school – including ties and shirts tucked in.

The back school gates will be open from 8.30am each morning and you should come on to the school site and go to your line up area to wait.

If you are coming in for a morning club then arrive through the main reception no later than **8.15am**.



Prohibited items

Contraband items that should not be brought into college:

- Alcohol
- Tobacco products, e.g. cigarettes & vapes
- Bangers
- Stink bombs
- Fireworks (would be reported to the police, may result in PEX)

Bringing any of above in will result in an APB placement or Fixed term exclusion.

Reminder...chewing gum and metal combs are also not allowed, if found in your possession, you will have a Saturday detention.

Prohibited items that should not be brought into the college:

- Drugs, e.g. cannabis
- Knives/ bladed item
- Imitation firearms, e.g. BB gun
- Firearms
- Any other type of weapon

Bringing any of the above in will result in a **Permanent exclusion** (PEX) and the Police will be involved.



Make sure you know what you are buying, unfortunately 'Edibles' which contain drugs like cannabis look very much like normal sweet packets.



Classroom Expectations



In every lesson, all pupils should meet the following expectations:

- Arrive on time, move quickly and quietly to your next lesson
- Arrive with correct uniform
- Arrive with all necessary equipment
- Arrive with completed homework
- Follow all teacher instructions in a timely fashion
- Apply yourself fully to all tasks throughout including completion of any challenge tasks
- Work with others in a collaborative manner.



When you meet and exceed these expectations you will be rewarded in various ways;

- Verbal praise
- Written praise (in book/journal)
- SIMS individual achievement points
- Positive phone call home.

If you fail to meet any of the lesson expectations, your teacher will carry out the steps below;

- 1) Two warnings
- 2) Minor mention
- 3) Major mention on SIMS
- 4) Removal to HOD/Dept – this may result in Saturday detention
- 5) SLT called – this will result in removal to the Alternative Provision Base (APB).

35+ points	1 day fixed term exclusion KS Lead + Meeting with parents with <i>N.B. depending on the severity of the sims mentions there may be a referral to the Principal and a longer fixed term exclusion.</i>



Punctuality reminder:

Students are expected to be in the College playground by **8.40am**. If a student arrives at the College gate at **8.41 or later** then they will be deemed as arriving late, this will have the following implications:

1-2 late/s to college in a week	Whole college detention

LEGO model of the ATLAS experiment

The ATLAS experiment is the largest of four huge particle detectors at CERN's Large Hadron Collider. Buried 100 metres below the ground near the Swiss-French border, ATLAS records high energy collisions between protons, allowing physicists to search for new particles and make measurements of fundamental phenomena. This model was built from 9,517 LEGO bricks by the Cambridge High Energy Physics Group over several days. It is roughly 1:50 scale; the real detector is 46 metres long and 25 metres high.

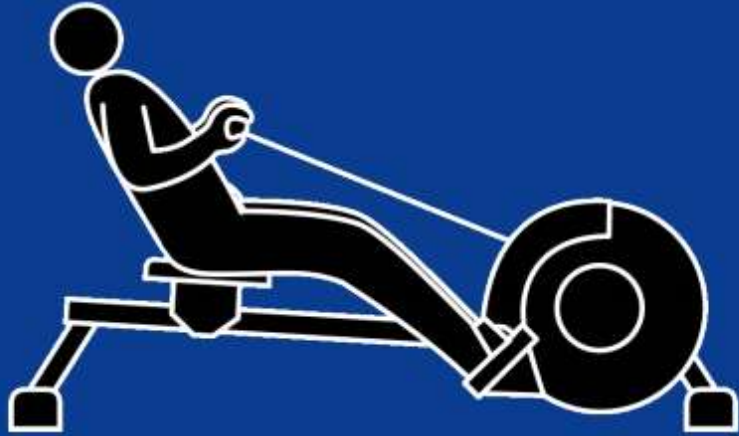

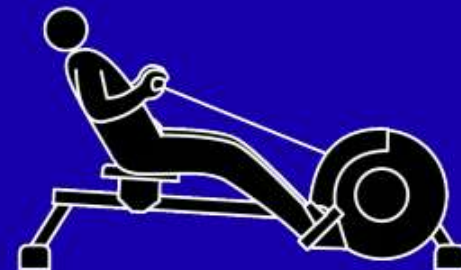

A bag of chips. That's all sixteen-year-old Rashad is looking for. What he finds instead is a fist-happy cop, Paul, who mistakes Rashad for a shoplifter, mistakes Rashad's pleadings that he's stolen nothing for belligerence, mistakes Rashad's every flinch at every punch the cop throws as further resistance and refusal to STAY STILL as ordered. But how can you stay still when someone is pounding your face into the pavement?

There were witnesses: Quinn - a varsity basketball player and Rashad's classmate who has been raised by Paul since his own father died in Afghanistan - and a video camera. Soon the beating is all over: the news and Paul is getting threatened with accusations of prejudice and racial brutality. Quinn refuses to believe that the man who has basically been his saviour could possibly be guilty. But then Rashad is absent. And absent again. And again. And the basketball team - half of whom are Rashad's best friends - start to take sides. As does the school. And the town. Simmering tensions threaten to explode as Rashad and Quinn are forced to face decisions and consequences they had never considered before.

Food from the canteen is not allowed to be taken outside as it encourages rats/pigeons etc which is a health risk.



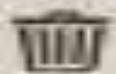
