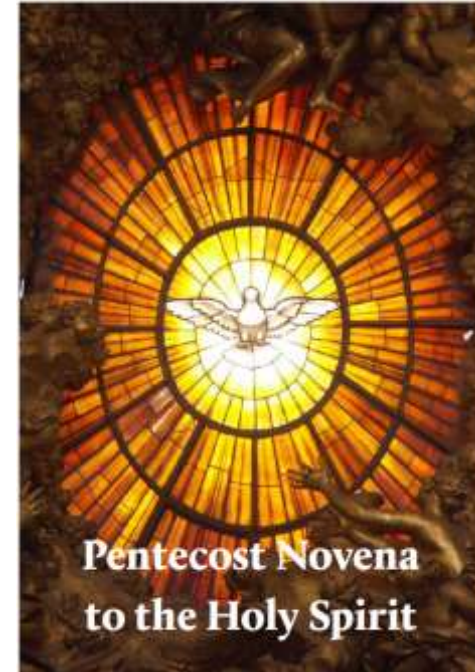
# *Liturgical Highlights for this Week;*

**Month of Mary:** This is the traditional time to set up a May Altar in the classroom with a statue of Mary, blue cloth, and fresh flowers.

**The "Advocate":** In the Gospels this week, Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit, the "Advocate," to help us.

**Friday, May 22: Feast of St. Rita of Cascia:** Known as the patron of "impossible causes" and "difficult situations." She is a great saint for anyone feeling like they've hit a wall with their revision or personal struggles.

**The Pentecost Novena:** Traditionally, the nine days between Ascension and Pentecost are a time of intense prayer for the Gifts of the Spirit.

## Igniting the Gifts within us

Traditionally, the nine days between Ascension and Pentecost are a time of intense prayer for the "Gifts of the Spirit." This week we will focus on one gift each day!

### Monday

#### Gift of Wisdom

Seeing the world through God's eyes, not just our own.

Look at a difficult situation (a hard revision topic or a disagreement with a friend). Instead of getting frustrated, ask: *"How would Jesus see this?"* Try to find one positive thing in that challenge today.

### Tuesday

#### Gift of Understanding

Going deeper than the surface to find the truth.

Be a "Deep Listener." In your lessons or at lunch, give someone your full attention. Don't just hear their words; try to understand how they are feeling.

### Wednesday

#### Gift of Counsel

*Knowing the difference between what is "okay" and what is "best."*

Use the "5-Second Rule." Before you react, speak, or send a message today, pause for five seconds and ask the Holy Spirit: *"Is this the best way to act?"*

### Thursday

#### Gift of Courage

The strength to do the right thing, even when it's hard.

Be the "Bravesoul." Stand up for someone who is being left out, or stay focused on your work even when everyone else is distracted. Do the hard thing first today.

### Friday

#### Gift of Knowledge

Recognising God's fingerprints on the world around us.

Be the "Eureka" Moment. In your favorite subject today (Science, Art, History, or PE), find one fact or skill that amazes you. Realise that all truth and beauty comes from God.

# Tube Strikes this Week



Plan your journey to school to make sure you are here on time!

## Impact on Tube services

- The strikes will affect the whole Tube network
- A reduced service will run across most lines but significant disruption is expected
- Any services that do run will be less frequent, very busy, and you may not be able to board the first train
- No service expected on the Piccadilly and Circle lines
- No service expected on the Metropolitan line between Baker Street and Aldgate
- No service expected on the Central line between White City and Liverpool Street

## Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May and Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> May

- Until mid-morning: normal services
- Late morning: services ramping down ahead of strike
- After midday: significant disruption on all lines, continuing through the following day

## Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> May and Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> May

- Morning: significant disruption on all lines until midday
- Afternoon / evening: services recovering, with some disruption likely until the evening

## Elizabeth line, DLR, London Overground, buses and trams

- Elizabeth line, DLR, London Overground, and tram services will be running normally on strike days
- The vast majority of buses will be running normally throughout these strikes
