Thursday: The "Playground Inclusive" Dominic made sure no one was left out of games.

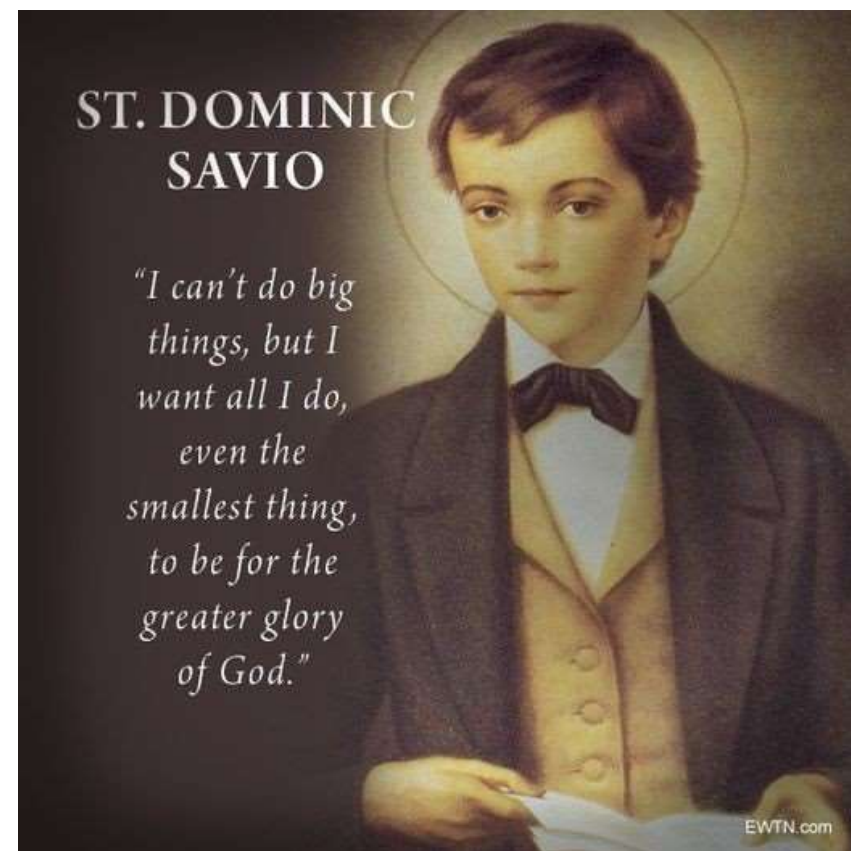
Goal: Look for someone who is standing alone during break time and invite them to join your group.
