# Tube Strikes Tues 2nd and Thurs 5th June

Students must plan ahead for tube strikes taking place this week. Look for alternatives on the TFL journey planner if your way to school is affected. Buses and roads will be busy so all students should leave earlier and walking may be the quickest route to school. We are not allowed to authorise absence for students due to tube strikes.

## **Impact on Tube services**

During the strike action, no service is expected on the Circle line, the Piccadilly line, the Metropolitan line between Baker Street and Aldgate, and the Central line between White City and Liverpool Street.

Services are due to run on other Tube lines on both days but there will be disruption to journeys.

Service levels will vary across the Tube network

Services will start late and finish early

There will be limited services before 06:30 on both days

Customers should complete their journeys before 21:00 on both days

Normal service is expected on Monday 1 June, Wednesday 3 June and Friday 5 June.

Elizabeth line, DLR, London Overground, buses and trams

Other TfL services will run as normal, but are likely to be busy.

# Feast of Corpus Christi

## Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> June

The **Feast of Corpus Christi** (Latin for "Body of Christ") is a major feast day in the Catholic Church, 60 days after Easter

### What is it for?

At its core, the feast is a **celebration of the Eucharist** and the doctrinal belief in the **Real Presence** of Jesus Christ in the bread and wine. While the institution of the Eucharist is technically remembered on Holy Thursday (during Holy Week), that day sits in the somber shadow of Christ's upcoming betrayal and crucifixion. Corpus Christi was established to create a joyful, standalone celebration focusing entirely on gratitude for the sacrament.

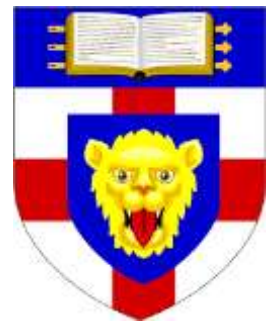

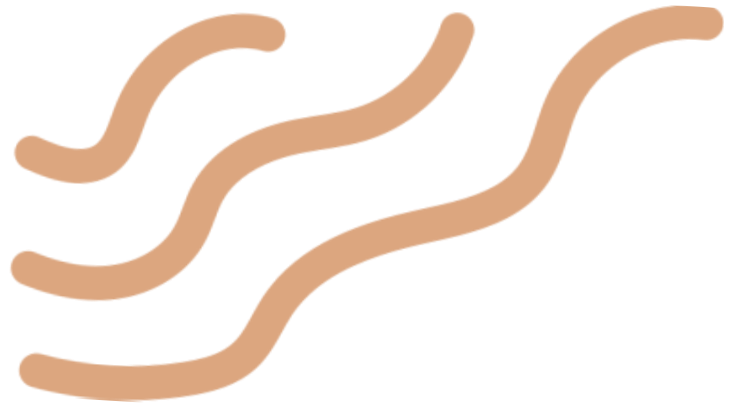
# Letters to Pope Leo

Food from the canteen is not allowed to be taken outside as it encourages rats/pigeons etc which is a health risk.



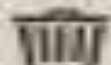
