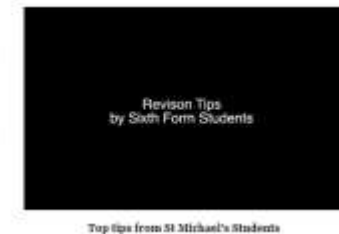

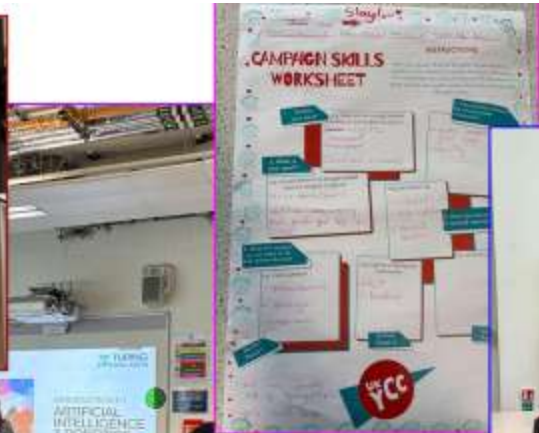

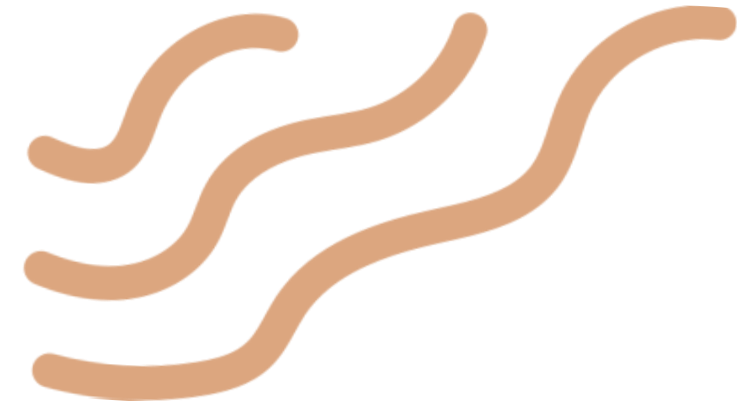
We're going to write a letter to Pope Leo.

Food from the canteen is not allowed to be taken outside as it encourages rats/pigeons etc which is a health risk.



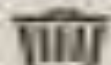
