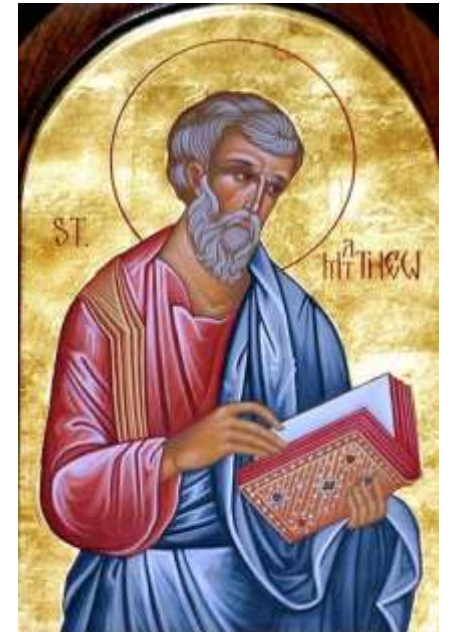

Make a Positive Turnaround

Monday is the Feast of St. Matthew, who left behind his old life to follow Christ. Identify one area in school where you need a fresh start—whether that means improving your effort in a subject, speaking more respectfully, or being more punctual—and make a positive turnaround this week.

Reflect and Make Amends

On Monday, Jewish communities in London and across the world mark the end of **Yom Kippur** (the Day of Atonement), the holiest day of the Jewish year, dedicated to fasting, deep reflection, and seeking forgiveness. 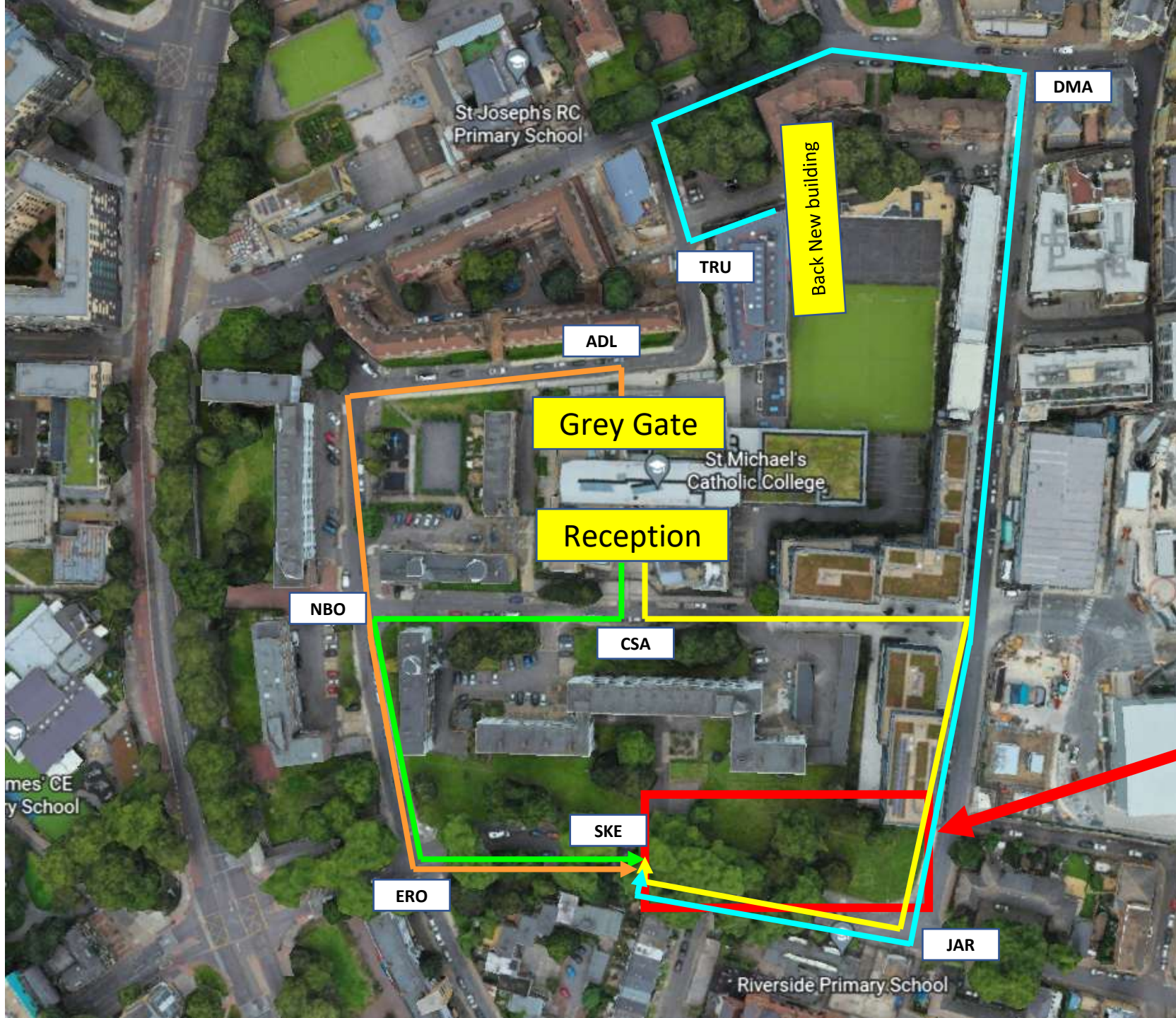
Fire Evacuation Muster Point



For all students, the procedure is as follows:

- On hearing the fire alarm, pupils must **leave their belongings and leave the classroom in single file, in a calm, orderly manner** (no running). **You must not speak.**
- You will be directed to the nearest staircase/exit route and led to our Muster Point, which is the green area on the corner of Chambers Street and Bevington Street (see map next slide).
- Once at the muster point, you will be directed to your tutor group, **you should get into alphabetical order as quickly as possible so that the register can be taken.**
- You may have to wait for a little while, be patient.
- Once safe to, you will be directed back to the building.
